

#### Janitors Course Evaluations from Expansion Pilot Programs

Property Services workers clean and disinfect our built environment including residential and office buildings, as well as public spaces like airports and retail establishments. These workers are primarily people of color, immigrants, and women. Their work is often low-paid, contingent, and insecure.

ESF collaborated with SEIU and Building Skills Partnership, a property services-focused training organization, to expand the "Green Janitor Education Program" created by BSP in California. The 30 hour course develops janitors' skills as the "eyes and ears" of a building focused on practices to reduce electricity and water usage, improve recycling and waste stream management, implement green cleaning chemicals and techniques, and protect health and safety for all. The program is certified by the U.S. Green Building Council - Los Angeles and janitors get certified as a "Green Janitor" after passing the course.

As our communities work to combat climate change, ESF and SEIU remain committed to engaging essential workers who suffer the most from the impacts of the climate crisis. Janitors have been and will remain critical to our efforts to reduce emissions, and make our communities and workplaces cleaner, greener, and safer.


This report compiles data from Green Janitor course evaluations completed by 43 janitors in Portland, Oregon, Denver and Colorado who completed the certification between November, 2021 and March, 2022. We look forward to piloting the program in additional cities, including Seattle, Chicago, and Minneapolis later in 2022 and further expansion of this critical program in the years to come.














#### In general, the GJEP course was:
